Written examinations: There are always 3 dates at the end of the semester. First date is usually the final class. Both repeat dates can follow flexibly—however, with a gap of at least 4 weeks between the dates. Notify the academic office of the planned repeat dates. Record results in STiNE at the latest 2 weeks after examination date and notify academic office about those students who have failed so that these students can apply for a new date as soon as possible.



Term papers: The central repeat dates per semester apply. For the summer semesters, these are 30 September, 31 December, and 31 March; for the winter semesters, 31 March, 30 June, and 30 September. Record results in STiNE at the latest 4 weeks after the respective repeat examination date and notify the academic office about those students who have failed so that these students can apply for a new date as soon as possible.

The processing time depends on the degree program / degree and begins when the topic is issued:

- Major philosophy, bachelor of arts (until Summer Semester 2023): 6 weeks
- Major philosophy, bachelor of arts (from Winter Semester 2023/24): 12 weeks
- Major philosophy, master of arts: 5 months
- Teacher training philosophy, bachelor of education LASEk: 4 months
- Teacher training philosophy, master of education LASEk: 5 months
- Teacher training philosophy, bachelor of education LAGym: 6 weeks
- Teacher training philosophy, master of education LAGym: 5 months
